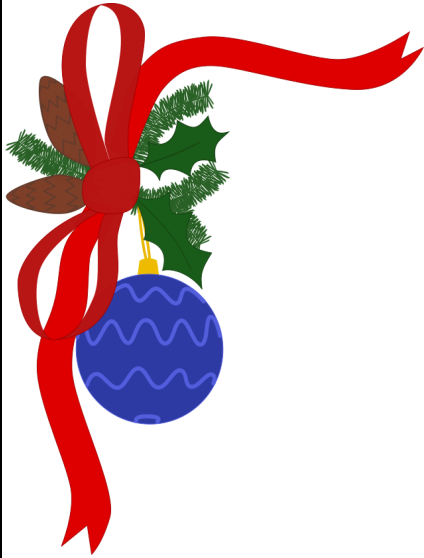

Norse Home Bazaar Treasures - A Great Success!

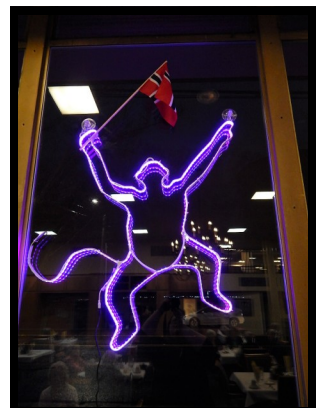
